- Provides supporting information for the 13 areas of competency underlying the leadership curriculum standards.
- Provides guidance on evaluating leadership candidates.
- Provides direction on "apprentices and apprenticeship" for the aspiring Trainer candidate as well as the Trainer of record responsible for apprentices.
- Highlights leadership course policies and administrative processes and procedures.
- Includes Trainer Tips and Case Studies.

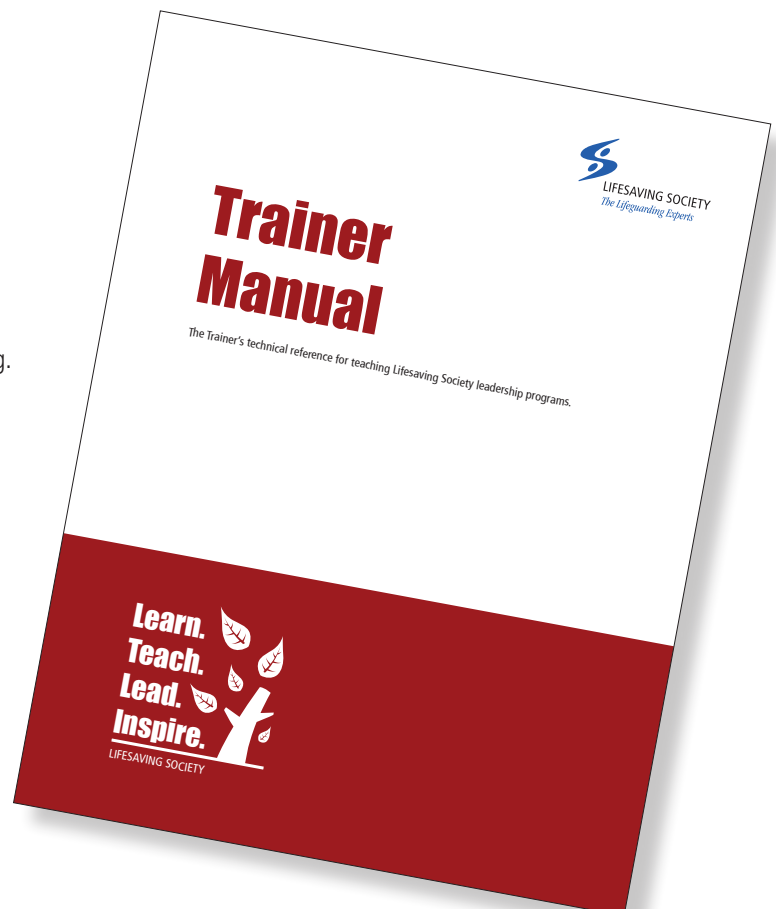

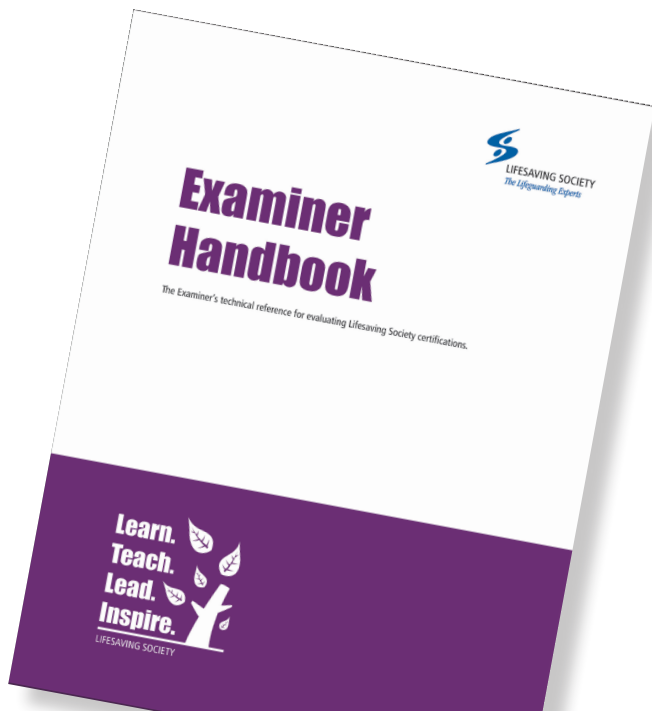

New Examiner Handbook now available

The *Examiner Handbook* provides the essential knowledge and tools required to plan and conduct Lifesaving Society examinations. All active Lifesaving Society examiners need the *Examiner Handbook* and it is the required text for candidates on Lifesaving Society Examiner courses. The *Examiner Handbook*:

- Defines examiners' job and explores their professional responsibilities.
- Provides guidance on planning and conducting fair and efficient examinations.
- Provides information on relevant policies and administrative process and procedures.
- Provides direction regarding use of award guides in planning and executing the examination.
- Provides direction concerning types of examinations: original versus recertifications; continuous evaluation, multiple awards at same time; "challenge" exams.
- Provides guidance on "apprentices and apprenticeship" for the aspiring examiner candidate as well as the Examiner Mentor responsible for apprentices.

Introducing Examiner Mentors

In January, the Society introduces a new Examiner Mentor designation – senior Examiners appointed by the Society to mentor examiner candidates through their apprenticeship and to decide if the candidate is ready for certification as an Examiner.

Examiner Mentors will:

- Provide effective apprenticeship experiences for examiner candidates including evaluation of their performance and guidance on their professional development as potential Lifesaving Society Examiners.
- Assist in the identification, recruitment and development of potential Lifesaving Society Examiners.
- Act as expert resources to Lifesaving Society apprenticing examiner candidates in matters related to Lifesaving Society evaluation standards.

Experienced Examiners who wish to become an Examiner Mentor must:

- Hold a current Examiner certification and have examining experience (i.e., at least 3 exams) in the stream(s) in which they wish to mentor apprenticing examiners.
- Apply to the Lifesaving Society office with a letter of recommendation.

Certification as a Lifesaving Society Trainer is desirable.
