

Society releases 2020 Newfoundland and Labrador Drowning Report

Drowning fatalities remain at historic lows, equal with the province's previous lowest rate, but still nearly double the Canadian average according to the Society's recent Newfoundland and Labrador Drowning Report. Fishing is the most common recreational activity when drowning occurs, and males continue to account for 95% of drowning deaths. Learn more .

Standard First Aid Recertification

WorkplaceNL has advised the Society that an 8-hour Standard First Aid recertification course is no longer an accepted format to maintain certification as a workplace first aid provider. Standard First Aid award holders must complete a full 16-hour Standard First Aid course following each 3-year currency period to remain certified.

To comply with Newfoundland and Labrador's *Occupational Health* and *Safety First Aid Regulations*, the Lifesaving Society retires its Standard First Aid recertification course effective **October 1**, **2020**. Certifications earned on Standard First Aid recert courses completed prior to this date remain valid.

Policy change reminders

The Society has implemented several policy changes throughout 2020. Check in with the <u>Society's homepage</u> regularly to stay up to date. In case you missed them, here's a summary:

No more SFA recertification courses: To comply with Newfoundland and Labrador's Occupational Health and Safety First Aid Regulations, the Lifesaving Society retires its Standard First Aid recertification course effective October 1, 2020. Readmore.

Age of certification change for NLS and Swim and Lifesaving Instructor: The Lifesaving Society Canada adopted 15 years as the minimum age prerequisite for certification as a National Lifeguard or Swim and Lifesaving Instructor. The Society's minimum age for certification has no impact on the minimum age for employment for instructors and lifeguards (16 years) established by the Newfoundland and Labrador government in regulation 1023/96. First Aid prerequisites: In light of the growth in the number of first aid providers and recent changes in government regulations, the Lifesaving Society has broadened access to its lifesaving and lifeguard courses by accepting, for prerequisite purposes, SFA certifications provided by training agencies approved by the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador. First aid valid for 3 years: In the interests of reducing confusion among employers, and harmonizing the Lifesaving Society currency period with Newfoundland and Labrador government regulations, CSA recommendations and the general practice among other workplace first aid providers, the Society has adopted a 3-year period for the validity of its Emergency First Aid and Workplace Standard First Aid certifications. 

Vocational award extension has ended

To support aquatic staff and the re-opening of aquatic facilities, the Lifesaving Society extended the validity of vocational awards expiring March 1, 2020 or later. **This extension period ended October 1, 2020**. Award holders whose certifications have expired must recertify to maintain currency.
